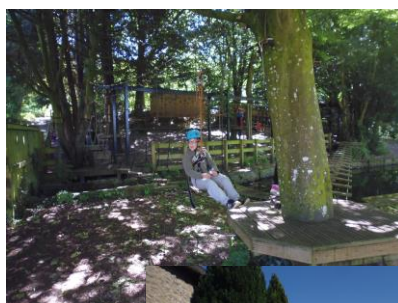




Primary PE and Sport Premium - Bleasdale C of E Primary School
